FINANCIAL SUMMARY MARCH 2022

Income for March was \$23,131 and was more than planned for by -\$1,124. Expenses for March were \$25,351 and were more than the planned expenses by +\$2,179. March income of \$23,131 less March expenses of \$25,351 means we took in less money than we spent by -\$2,219.54. YTD income of \$72,423 less YTD expenses of \$76,901.98 leaves us with a loss of \$4,479.12. Thank you all for mailing in or dropping off your donations. Your generosity is greatly appreciated!

Prayer Shawl and Afghan Ministry

In 1998, Janet Severi Bristow and Victoria Galo, two graduates of the 1997 Women's Leadership Institute at The Hartford Seminary in Hartford, Connecticut, gave birth to this *Prayer Shawl Ministry*. The love of knitting/crocheting have been combined into a prayerful ministry and spiritual practice that reaches out to those in need of comfort and solace, as well as in celebration and joy. Many blessings are prayed into every stitch.

Whether they are called Prayer Shawls, Comfort Shawls or Peace Shawls, the shawl maker begins with prayers and blessings for the recipient. The intentions are continued throughout the creation of the shawl. Upon completion, a final blessing is offered before the shawl is sent on its way.

At Hope Lutheran, Freehold, NJ, our Prayer Shawl Ministry began when Grace Lutheran, River Edge, NJ sent four shawls for our pastor to give to the families of two youngsters, 12-year-old Graeme Preston and 13-year-old Kevin Clawson, who were killed while skateboard-ing. They were struck by a minivan in a residential street at dusk in May 2008. What a trage-dy!

The shawls were a loving and wonderful gesture and very thoughtful of Rev. Steve Sweet and the ladies from Grace in River Edge. That very year the Women of Hope Lutheran organized Hope's Prayer Shawl Ministry. Hundreds upon hundreds of shawls have passed through the hands of four or five women knitting or crocheting, and pastor blessing each before giving them out to individuals who have been diagnose with an illness or to families who have lost loved ones, or whatever the need. I do believe there is a prayer in every stitch as my shawls have three sets of stitches or rows (meaning, Father, Son and Holy Spirit).

Here at Our Savior, the Prayer Shawl Ministry began in 2007. The shawls are made by individual members and friends and are given when the need arises.

Afghan (throws or shawls) Ministry for Veterans......Many *red, white and blue* afghans are given each November on Veterans Day to the Veterans at the Freddie Gonzalez Veterans Home. The afghans are blessed here at Our Savior the Sunday before Veterans Day. Any member of Our Savior may attend the ceremony and help distribute the afghans. As many as 75 afghans are made and distributed each year. The veterans receiving the afghans are very appreciative. This ministry began by *Lena Doering* several years ago. *Bink Phillips* is the coordinator of this ministry and event. If you have any questions, please contact her at 816-405-6825.

Donations of red, white and blue yarn are appreciated as a friend of Our Savior has crocheted several afghans each year. You may bring to the church and make sure Bink receives your donation. The shawls and afghans can be knitted, crocheted, quilted, woven, or machine knitted.

The father of small children was commiserating about how hard it is to keep the house clean with energetic, active, creative kids at home.
