Pastor's Newsletter Article


Greetings in Jesus' Name,

FINANCIAL SUMMARY SEPTEMBER 2022

Income for September was \$20,282.91 and was more than planned for by +\$423. Expenses for September were \$19,907 and were less than the planned expenses by \$885. September income of \$20,283 less September expenses of \$19,907 means we took in more money than we spent by +\$376. YTD income of \$194,105 less YTD expenses of \$209,442 leaves us with a loss of \$15,337. Hopefully as the Winter Texans start returning donations will increase and we will be able to minimize our year to date loss. Thank you all for mailing in or dropping off your donations. Your generosity is greatly appreciated!

'This is what we do' to honor a brother

The one-hour visitation/funeral service began at 10:30 on a Thursday morning in March. By 10:25, folks already were lining up to pay respects. They wore hats and jackets emblazoned with American Legion, Elks and VFW insignias. They were men and women, 20-somethings on up to elders with canes. They filled six pages of the guest book, signing their branch of service along with their names — Navy, Army, Air Force, Marine Corps, Coast Guard as well as a group of active military members from a close by military base and members of the local police department also attended. "We're all veterans, we're all brothers and sisters." "No man is left behind. This is what we do." Said a representative from the Elk's Lodge.

After the bugler played taps, this young lady who had known this individual 'as grandfather' was amazed by the attendance. Her mother had been a nurse and because of her nature of helping people, had offered help to her neighbor, who had no remaining family (the man who the taps had been played). For many years her mother made sure he had food and rides to doctor appointments. As time passed, the 'grandfather' was placed in a nursing home after suffering a stroke, and the young lady's mother had died. This young lady continued to visit 'grandfather'. This 84-year old veteran died alone. This young lady was the only contact.

At the funeral, the young lady was so overwhelmed when she turned around and the room was filled with a sea of faces. She hadn't prepared a eulogy as she didn't think anyone would be there to hear what she had to say. But there they were! Men and women from these Lodges and First Responders. They came because, "This is What We Do".

Her own father was "a lifer in the Navy," so she understood the bonds. What happened today goes beyond that, though. It wasn't just about the military. It was about humanity. "I'm sure there are other people who are buried who have no one coming to their funeral," she remarked. "Maybe someone will see this and say, 'We should consider doing this'. That would be wonderful. It meant the world to me."

She pledged to sift through the guestbook and send thank-you notes to all who attended. There's at least one person she won't be able to reach. Befitting the nature of the gathering, where the principle trumped the personal, one signature amidst the list of names said it all. It read, simply, "A. Friend."

A Budget is a Statement of Faith

What does your church's annual budget represent?

Is it a proud menu of the hopes, dreams and missionary ministries your congregation wants to accomplish in the year to come?

Or is it a life-support prescription for how the congregation expects to pay the staff, keep the lights burning, the staff paid and property maintained?

In a workshop when she was stewardship officer for the Episcopal Church, the late Terry Parsons gave this "Devil's Dictionary" definition of a church budget: "It is the means by which we notify the Lord of the limitations we intend to impose on his gifts for the coming year."

If we view the budget—and present it to our congregations—as an administrative necessity to ensure proper financial management, then we shouldn't be surprised to wind up with bare-bones measures that are grudgingly funded. If funded at all.

But if we present the budget to our congregations as opportunities to invest in the Reign of God and stretch ourselves to see how much we can do with even the nickels and dimes God has given us, then the possibilities increase.

In the end, a budget is a statement about how a congregation views the future. Do your people trust that ours is the God of abundance who rewards faithful stewards and will stand behind servants who proclaim the Reign of God? If an outsider looked at your budget, what would he or she conclude about your congregation's faith?

And what would be a "God's Dictionary" definition of a church budget? How about, "It is the means by which we make the most of the abundance the Lord is giving us." Hmmm. That will look nice on the cover of the annual report.
