We see that in all the symbols and decorations in the sanctuary during this month of December—the Advent Wreath with candles, the Blue Paraments with the meaning of Hope, the Christmas Tree and its many Crismons, the Nativity Set up front with the baby Jesus wrapped up until Christmas Eve. #### **FINANCIAL SUMMARY OCTOBER 2022**

Income for October was \$22,099.69 and was less than planned for by -\$1,013.89. Expenses for October were \$22,485 and were more than the planned expenses by -\$1,497.83. October income of \$22,099.69 less October expenses of \$22,484.67 means we took in less money than we spent by -\$384.98. YTD income of \$216,205 less YTD expenses of \$231,927.06 leaves us with a loss of \$15,722. Hopefully as the Winter Texans start returning donations will increase and we will be able to minimize our year to date loss. Thank you all for mailing in or dropping off your donations. #### Christmas Carols

Do we get an opportunity to enjoy, and/or sing the famous Christmas Carols/Hymns enough? Advent begins the liturgical new year and is the season (four Sundays) to prepare for the birth of Jesus. Christmas Eve worship services are filled with the joy of this most silent-holy night, little town of Bethlehem, and of Jesus being born in a manger. And then on a low Sunday, meaning the Sunday After Christmas, we sing Christmas Hymns. Depending on the calendar, we may go right into The Epiphany on January 6. Oh no! No more Christmas Hymns. Children who do not attend church services may not get the opportunity to learn these beautiful carols as they are not sung except in houses of worship and then most times only during the Sundays between Christmas Eve and Epiphany, or by those faithful music directors' homes, or those who host Christmas parties and may have recordings of these wonderful carols. The youngsters get an opportunity if their Pastor and/or Youth Group Leader schedules caroling, or Sunday School Teachers sings carols during class on Sunday mornings. A friend of mine plays her piano nearly every night and the last song is Silent Night before retiring. Another friend, a former choir director, would host a choir member Christmas party each year and they would stop the festivities of the evening to sing carols. By staying true to the theme of the liturgical calendar, means we hold off singing Christmas music/hymns until the Advent season concludes on Christmas Eve. Thank you to the clergy who introduce Christmas Hymns during Advent. Some of the most popular carols:

*O Holy Night* -- Placide Cappeau, a wine seller from southern France, was asked by the local parish priest to write a festive poem in 1847 to celebrate the church organ's renovation. Cappeau felt it should be accompanied by music, so approached his friend Adolphe Charles Adams. Adams' text reflects on the birth of Jesus and of humanity's redemption.

Hark! The Herald Angels Sing -- With lyrics written by Charles Wesley, and set to a tune by Mendelssohn, this carol was always going to be one of the most recognizable and popular ones on the list. It's also got a cracking descant.

O Little Town of Bethlehem -- Following a pilgrimage to the Holy Land, Rector Phillips Brooks wrote the text to this hymn after he was inspired by the view of Bethlehem from the hills of Palestine. Three years later in 1871, his church organist Lewis Redner wrote the melody for the local Sunday school children's choir.

Joy to the World -- Rather than celebrating the birth of Christ, the text of this hymn represents Christ's triumphant return. The words, dreamed up by English writer Isaac Watts, are based on the second half of Psalm 98 in the Bible. In the late '90s, it was named the most-published Christmas hymn in North America. You can just feel the merriness pouring out of it.

Away in a Manger -- This late 19th-century carol is hugely popular with children. The melody was originally composed in 1837 by Jonathan E. Spilman, but was later adapted in 1895 by William J Kirkpatrick.

Silent Night -- Originally written in German, 'Stille Nacht' was composed in 1818 by Franz Xaver Gruber with lyrics by Joseph Mohr, and was translated to English in 1859. During the Christmas truce of 1914 during World War I, the carol was sung simultaneously by English and German troops. "Silent Night," it turns out, is not merely the most popular carol; with 733 copyrighted recordings since 1978, it is nearly twice as dominant as "Joy to the World".

Blessings this Christmas and throughout the new year.

### Have yourself a Holy little Christmas

The "Christmas season " seems to begin earlier every year. Some stores had Christmas stuff on the shelves weeks before Halloween. What madness! We go dashing through the stores to the beat of Jingle Bells; and we go "Rockin' Around the Christmas Tree" until we crash from exhaustion.

Revelry and gift-giving are fine and fun, but if we're not careful they can snowball out of control. Stewarding a Holy and meaningful Christmas means balancing the commercial with the spiritual. Here are some tips:

**Observe Advent:** The four weeks before Christmas Day comprise the Advent Season, a time to *prepare* for Christmas through prayer, song, worship, and spiritual disciplines. Lean into the spirit of Advent. Advent devotionals can help (I recommend Richard Rohr's Preparing for Christmas).

**Observe the Christmas season:** The church calendar lists the season of Christmas from Dec. 24 to the feast of Epiphany on Jan. 6. Until the 20th century, these 12 days of Christmas were the time for celebration and partying. Make them special in your life and family.

**Cut the consumerism:** Limit your shopping and spending by setting a strict budget of gifting the people in your life with homemade presents, favors, or ways to spend time together.

**Party hardly:** For some, Christmas is an excuse to overeat and drink to excess. Moderate your consumption.

**Most importantly, pray:** Ask God to help you and your family craft a meaningful and joyful Advent and Christmas. Ask God to send you wisdom, resources, and people who can journey through the spiritual season with you.

By carefully stewarding your faith life, Advent and Christmas can be a time for real spiritual growth.



Join us Sunday, December 4th for the first Handbell Practice at noon after the 2nd ser vice. All are welcome to play!


