THISTLE FARMS – Love Heals

Several years ago, I had the opportunity to attend the Women of the ELCA Triennial Gathering in Charlotte, NC and one of the keynote speakers was The *Rev. Becca Stevens*. The dynamic *Rev. Becca Stevens* is an author, speaker, Episcopal priest, social entrepreneur, founder and president of *Thistle Farms* in Nashville, Tennessee. She spoke for over two hours, and everyone was on the edge of their seats listening to every word she had to say. After experiencing the death of her father and subsequent child abuse when she was 5, Becca longed to open a sanctuary for survivors offering a loving community. *Love Heals!* She is notable for founding Magdalene in 1997, now called *Thistle Farms*, to heal, empower, and employ female survivors of human trafficking, prostitution, and addiction. Becca's hope for a global movement for women's freedom began with *Thistle Farms*' first residential home. In 1997, five women who had experienced trafficking, violence, and addiction were welcomed in this place to call 'home'. *Thistle Farms* houses up to 36 residents at a time in a therapeutic setting that offers healing and transformation through housing, healthcare, counseling, employment, and community building. Housing and clinical services are free of charge and provided without Federal assistance. *Love Heals!*

Love Heals - We believe that love is more powerful than all the forces that drive women to the street, and a strong community will help them not only heal but thrive. Our homes operate on a holistic model. Residents do not have live-in staff, instead are guided by principles grounded in accountability, trust, and growth. We continue to recognize the immense need for our program as our waitlist - capped at 100 women - is consistently full. The work of love is to keep lighting the way for millions of women still searching for a way out. For 25 years, *Thistle Farms* has lit a pathway of healing and hope for women survivors of trafficking, prostitution, and addiction. Love Heals! Becca founded Magdalene in 1997, a two-year residential program for former prostitutes overcoming addiction and wanting to restart their lives. In 2001, she started *Thistle Farms*, which employs the same group of women to make home and body products sold in stores like Whole Foods and on *thistlefarms.org*. In 2013, *Thistle Farms* opened a café, employing survivors of prostitution, trafficking, and addiction. She has written several books. Her 2013 memoir, Snake Oil: The Art of Healing and Truth-*Telling*, "details her own sexual abuse and healing and how her ministry has led to the founding of *Thistle Farms*". There is a documentary entitled "*Practically Devine*" well worth watching. Her products have the thistle fragrance as that is what is grown on the farm. The women searching for their way, help to harvest and make the products i.e., candles, essential oils and more. *Love Heals!*

Therefore, be imitators of God, as beloved children. And walk in love as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us, a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God. Ephesians 5:1-2 *Beloved, let us love one another; for love is of God, and he who loves is born of God and knows God.* 1 John 4:7 RSV

The problem (and power) of money

[Jesus told the rich man] "You lack one thing; go, sell what you own, and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me." When he heard this, he was shocked and went away grieving, for he had many possessions. ... [Jesus taught the disciples,] "It is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for someone who is rich to enter the kingdom of God." –*Mark* 10:21b-22, 25

At a Bible study, a man of means asked, "Why does Jesus hate money so much?" His family saw their money as a good thing, and he earnestly wanted to understand why Jesus seems to speak negatively of wealth again and again.

In fact, Jesus talks about money more than nearly anything else. Interestingly, for all his talk about money, he never asks for it. And he never condemns it. Instead, Jesus warns us about the corrupting influence of money.

Wealth poses spiritual risks. Jesus teaches that money has the power to turn us inward – away from loving God with all our heart and loving our neighbor as ourselves. It confuses our values and direction.

All of us want full lives brimming with security, relationship, joy, peace and love – but money can ensure us none of those things. They are the fruits of loving God with ALL our strength and of loving our neighbor as ourselves. Wealth can get in the way.

That was the issue with the rich man in Mark 10:17-27. Deeply religious, he nonetheless worries about eternal life. The "one thing" he lacks, Jesus tells him, can be satisfied by selling what he has and giving to the poor. Generous giving would break the bond that money has over him and help re-center him on loving God and loving neighbor.

Generosity is the spiritual prescription Jesus gives the rich man, and it's the one for us, too.

The primary goal of our church's financial stewardship should not be to fund the church, but rather to break the chains that money may have on our hearts and souls. But giving generously we can help the church, our neighbor *and* ourselves. We can learn what it is to be free to love God with all our heart and our neighbor as ourselves.

We will plan a mortgage burning and celebration sometime in the late fall when we have more people in attendance. That should be a fun day!

There are people who still may want to contribute, and we will still accept donations marked for defibrillators and mortgage, but we will add that money to our capital outlay account. We will be needing new air conditioners for some of the rooms on our campus. Some of the AC units are 27 years old – way past their life expectancy. So, your money will be going to these and other needs of an aging campus and building.

May God bless all of you!

As of July 20th our mortgage has been paid off in full! We will be researching and ordering the defibrillators soon. Our goal was to raise \$23,000. As of July 23rd we have raised a total of \$17,690.00!
